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Ephphatha Lutheran Mission Society exists to bring the gifts of Christ to the Deaf community. This year there are many new things that ELMS is doing to reach out to the Deaf community with these gifts.

Tutoring Program

ELMS will open a tutoring program for the Deaf community at Emmanuel Lutheran Church and School in Dearborn, MI. Last year the Dearborn public school district had to close their program for Deaf students. Many of those student were forced to find a new town or to commute to places as far as Flint. ELMS seized this opportunity to create a new way to reach this community by providing tutoring. This program is set to start in February with 3-5 students receiving tutoring help.

Deaconess Work in the Deaf Community

ELMS recently became an internship site for the Deaconess program at Concordia University in Chicago. Diana Rice began in January of 2017. She is Deaf and it is her hope to be a deaconess to the Deaf community. Diana, her husband and her 4 children moved to Michigan back in September. Currently she is teaching an ASL class to the hearing children of Emmanuel Lutheran school, attending outreach opportunities in Deaf community events, caring for Deaf shut-ins and helping with ELMS tutoring program.

Partnership Churches and St. Martin Lutheran School for the Deaf

Emmanuel Lutheran Church and School has partnered with ELMS not only with the tutoring program, but they have also committed to teaching American Sign Language to all of their students as a second language. This is in preparation for the eventual opening of St. Martin Lutheran School for the Deaf.

In years past the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod was able to serve the Deaf community with Lutheran School for the Deaf in Detroit. After this school closed, there was no longer a way to access the youth in the Deaf community. This is why ELMS committed to starting another Deaf Lutheran School in cooperation with a hearing Lutheran School. Emmanuel has generously offered a room and joint activities during the day when students sign up for St. Martin.

It is our hope that within the next two years ELMS will open the doors again to the Deaf community for a Lutheran Education.
